The FEMA Grant funds have provided critical support for Safe Harbor's Anderson shelter. Funds are issued as a stipend per overnight stay and they cover basic shelter operation costs, such as security, utilities, food, and supplies. Over the last five years, FEMA funds have been used to support the shelter stays of 1,147 individuals in the Anderson shelter (718 adults and 429 children).
